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Delmarva Central Railroad Extends its Reach

On May 18 the Bay Coast Railroad ran its last train and shortly thereafter the Delmarva Central Railroad took over operations of the northernmost 14.8 miles of the BCR, from Pocomoke, MD, to Hallwood, VA, to continue service to remaining customers. On January 1, 2019 the DCR will also begin operating over the state-owned rails of what is now the Delaware Coast Line Railroad. The DCR's roster includes MP15AC, GP11, GP38-2 and SD40-2 locomotives wearing the paint scheme shown above. Parent company Carload Express purchased and refurbished 14 MP15AC switchers, some of which have entered service on the DCR. In the photo above, two such locomotives, DCR 1560 and 1563, pull a freight train on a sunny Delmarva day. Meanwhile, to the south, the Buckingham Branch Railroad is taking over the operation of former BCR tracks in the Norfolk area. Read about it in this High Green!
